



## Shipping Dangerous Goods – Limited Quantity Exemption

### Using the Limited Quantity exemption


The Limited Quantity exemption is a regulatory alternative to preparing shipments provided certain conditions are met. This exemption applies to small quantities of lower risk dangerous goods, other than explosives, which are identified in the regulations. If a dangerous good can be shipped using this exemption, it will have a number greater than zero shown in the column “Limited Quantity Index” (TDGR Schedule 1, Column 6).

Purolator **only accepts ground shipments** utilizing this exemption for both Purolator Courier and Purolator Freight shipments. The following table provides a summary of the requirements for tendering Limited Quantity shipments to Purolator.
